An Autumn Marked by Renewal

It was another busy spring, to say the least. However, vaccination has allowed us to reconnect with our loved ones and enjoy more flexible health measures during the summer. I hope you took advantage of that. Fall is also a time of renewal at the FFA-RIQ, thanks to the hard work of everyone involved.

Collective Agreement Approved by the FFARIQ FFs

The negotiations for the new collective agreement with the Ministry of Health and Social Services represented a large part of our actions over the past year: 41 meetings with the Ministry, numerous readings and internal meetings, discussions, consultations, and many hours of writing. On July 20, the agreement in principle that I presented to you was adopted by 98.4% of you, our foster family members.

This agreement (2020-2023) will come into effect as soon as it is signed by the Minister in September or early October. Our requests were numerous and based on your needs as well as the

major issues of the last 5 years. We are proud to have obtained changes and progress on the following points:

- Training.
- Collaboration with institutions.
- Conditions for stability.
- Security.
- Compensation.

Also, many clarifications have been made to the texts in order to eliminate the problematic areas and situations encountered in recent years. As a result, your conditions are greatly improved, and the importance of your role is more and more recognized.

With this collective agreement, we have succeeded in taking forward the cause of foster families and in improving the conditions under which services are provided. It is with great hope that we are looking to the near future to see what actions will follow the recommendations of the Laurent Commission report.

Provincial Tour

This fall, I will begin a provincial tour of the 8 regions with Chantale St-Pierre, consultant for the FFARIQ. Chantale is a former manager who had a career at the DYP and the CIUSSS of Mauricie. She is very familiar with the reality of foster families and was a precious help in preparing the negotiations and the development of the demands for the new collective agreement. Together, we will present the major changes of this new agreement and how to integrate and implement them in your daily life.

The FFARIQ team is now busy planning and preparing the necessary steps for the implementation and application of this new collective agreement. You will have access to all the information through our different communication channels.


Symposium: Always One Step Ahead for You!

Understanding the Unspoken to Better Support

In this world where it is so easy to send messages in all forms, it is often very difficult to really understand what is going on. Our speakers this year will focus on two issues that often hide great emotional needs and extreme vulnerability.



Geneviève Vohl

Geneviève Vohl will be speaking on the prevention of cyber addiction, cyber crime and hypersexualization among youth. Her conference will allow you to learn more about these subjects, but also how to protect our children. Ms. Vohl worked for a few years as a volunteer at the Cyber-aide Centre before becoming its assistant director. As a psychologist, she offers training to health professionals, conferences to children, teenagers and parents, and works with a diverse pediatric clientele in a private clinic.



Christian Martineau

Christian Martineau will present his conference "The secrets of non-verbal communication between parents and children". Mr. Martineau graduated with an Executive MBA from the University of Sherbrooke and embarked on a 3-year training program in non-verbal communication. It changed his life! If verbal communication (words) represents only 7% of communication (Albert-Mehrabian - 1971), imagine how much you can learn by demystifying all the non-verbal communication and the intonation of your interlocutor! Mr. Martineau can give the meaning of more than 2,500 unconscious gestures. He specializes in grasping gestures, that is, gestures concerning the relationship between the body and objects. In this conference, you will certainly learn many tricks to better decode the messages that your children send you.

COLLECTIVE DISAGREEMENT ON EXPENSE REIMBURSEMENT

In 2014, the FFARIQ filed a collective and ongoing disagreement regarding various FF claims related to reimbursable expenses incurred for users. Specifically, this disagreement addresses the entitlement to reimbursement for expenses provided for:

- in the collective agreement.
- in the ministerial circular.
- in the directive on reimbursable expenses during travel and other inherent expenses as well as on prescriptions by professionals and health.
- all other claims authorized by the Act.

In short, the disagreement covers all types of existing fees related to the services to be provided to the user and that the institution refuses to reimburse.

Court Decisions

The arbitration tribunal heard a few test cases of claims as early as 2014 and ruled favourably on some of them. The institutions appealed this decision and in April 2021, the Quebec Court of Appeal ruled to uphold the arbitrator's decision. The institutions have decided not to take this decision to the Supreme Court of Canada. Therefore, the dispute is back before the arbitration tribunal.



The arbitrator suggests that, before proceeding further, the parties (i.e., the FFARIQ and the institutions) attempt to reach an agreement on the settlement of the fees that have not yet been decided. Therefore, we need your help.

We have sent you a chart to list all fee claims that have not been reimbursed or allowed between July 2014 and October 1, 2021. You need to get this list and supporting documentation to us quickly. Thank you to those FFs who have already done so.

With this information in hand, we can negotiate with institutions. If we are unsuccessful, we are scheduled to have the arbitration tribunal hear the case quickly.



Providing a Safe Place for Over 100 Children

Gisèle and Gaétan became FF in the Gaspé/Les Îles region nearly 30 years ago. At the time, they had two biological boys who are now 45 and 42 years old. They have welcomed more than 100 children, sometimes 7 at the same time. Most of these children are between the ages of 7 and 18 and have found a haven at Gisèle and Gaétan's home. However, in response to an urgent need, the couple agreed to take in a 3-year-old girl a few years ago, whom we will call Sunshine, at Gisèle's suggestion. Here is her story and the story of a couple who show empathy with a capital "E".

THE ARRIVAL OF SUNSHINE

Gisèle and Gaétan have a well-established lifestyle with the preteens and teens in their care. They regularly go to their cottage, make a fire, stay up a little later. When the social worker approached them about taking in a 3-year-old girl, Gisèle and Gaétan were hesitant. How could they reconcile the pace of life of such a young child with that of their grownups? In the end, it was their big hearts that made the decision: they were going to try. If everything went well with the other 4 children, the little one could stay. If not, the social worker would have to find another family.

Sunshine was in the care of an aunt (a local foster family), but she was finding it difficult to care for the 3-year-old.

Developmental delay, attachment disorder, hyperactivity: these problems represented great challenges to overcome. The Lussier-Gignac family opened their door to her. From the start, the four other children in the family took the little girl under their wing and protected her like their little sister.

The situation was not easy. The little one got up at 5:00 a.m. every morning. Her hyperactivity and attachment disorder meant that she demanded, and still demands, a lot of attention. She may repeat her questions and requests over and over again until she is attended to. It can be a real hassle to have such a "nagging" little sister for preteens and teens!

As soon as she arrived in the family, Sunshine had numerous follow-ups every week (orthotherapist, occupational therapist, physiotherapist) to help her catch up on her developmental delay, notably a weakness in her lower limbs and inability to hold a pencil to draw, as well as deficiencies in fine motor skills. Little Sunshine never gave up, always enthusiastically taking part in the weekly exercises that the educator, who came to her home, put her through.

Perseverance is an important trait for this little girl who is entering Grade 3 this fall. Although she has doubled up on her preschool because of her developmental delay and despite learning difficulties, she works hard, wants to get ahead and takes her homework and lessons to heart. For example, in addition to the 20 minutes of daily study time that the other children do, Sunshine does an extra 30 minutes of work to catch up, voluntarily and without grumbling. It's partly by highlighting Sunshine's successes that both the school and the Lussier-Gignac's motivate the young girl to persevere and give it her all. She is very happy when she sees a "B" for "well" on her assignments and exams.

"For our Sunshine, school is like therapy. She has friends, she has her social network. School is positive," says Gisèle. We know what she can give. We set goals just high enough for her to experience success and gain confidence in her abilities. With each small success, she catches up.

DEVELOPING LONG-TERM RELATIONSHIPS

Gisèle and Gaétan have always had a house full of tweens and teens. How do they keep it together? "The approach is different. It requires more supervision and communication. At that age, they compare themselves with others, and that's normal. They're going to want to go home at midnight and do what their friends are doing. You have to take the time to explain to them that when you live with several people, as we do, a parent has to stay up even to wait for one child, and the next day, it's a race that starts early in the morning. It is important to make people aware that every action has an impact on the other members of the family. These children are often in their 2nd or 3rd placement where each family had its rules. These kids are very resilient!"

This great empathy that Gisèle shows, she also has it towards the biological parents with whom she maintains a good relationship. "I put myself in their shoes. Sometimes parents are at the end of their rope. They are experiencing a failure, it's not easy." I often say that if one of my children had been

placed, I would have been the worst birth mother in the world, because I would have wondered why I hadn't been able to raise him and how another family could do it."

One of the things she remembers is a young girl with a drug addiction whom she and her partner took in a few years ago. The girl's father had left his loving spouse because he could no longer tolerate his daughter's abuse. He felt he was at the end of his rope and was afraid of physically losing control. So he preferred to leave. After her stay with the Lussier-Gignac's, the girl returned to her parents who are living together again. With the support given to her by Gisèle and Gaétan, the young girl stopped using drugs and today, she works with young addicts.



GRATEFUL YOUTH

When the young people leave the Lussier Gignac family, they leave a little message. Gisèle particularly remembers Annie's message: "You are not responsible for the failure that I am. For once I found a real father and a real mother and for some bullshit, I was forced to enter a youth centre at 17." And also that of Fannie, who has been with them for less than a year:

"You allowed me to regain control over my life".

Gisèle and Gaétan greatly appreciate the many small and large successes they have experienced with the 100 or so children who have lived with them. Before making the choice to become FF, they were considering buying a seniors' residence. However, the crying need for FF and Gaétan's experience as the vice-president of the Grands frères de la vallée du Richelieu led them to want to help children in need. If they had to do it all over again today, they would make the exact same decision!

SETTING THE SCENE:

You get together as a family after months of not seeing each other. You are relieved to finally be together, excited, feverish, and somewhat anxious. Mother Nature seems unsure of what she will deliver for the day, but a small tent is provided just in case... The long-awaited moment finally arrives. You arrive at the outdoor gathering place. You notice that your sister has gained weight since you saw her, that your brother is still talking loudly, that your mother doesn't stop for two minutes to enjoy the precious time you have, that your father is grumpy, as always. The kids are running around you as you pass, and you drop your drink on your pants. And to top it all off, it starts to rain.

POSSIBLE REACTION:

You tell yourself that, in the end, it's all the same with these family meetings. The excitement ends in discouragement, you are exhausted. What did you miss? You roll your eyes, criticize out loud or in your head the behaviour of your loved ones. The rain gives you a reason to end the activity and return to the comfort of your home.

Do you recognize yourself in this type of situation?

What if I told you that the main part of the problem is your brain, what would you say?

Identifying problems, what is not working as it should, possible collateral effects, solutions to ensure our safety and survival, that's what our brain is conditioned to do. What if it was time to teach it something else, to condition it differently? This is what I propose with the positive approach. Reconditioning our brain (or going back to our childhood brain) in order to see the beautiful, to bring out the strengths, to leave behind the apprehensions that tint our daily experiences.

A child's brain would have a completely different perception of said family reunion.

Grandpa is funny with his grumpy face. Grandma is nice to help us and to pick up for us. Auntie is so warm with her hugs and kisses. Our uncle always manages to tell us good stories! Oops, we spilled daddy's drink, but that's okay, it's just pants. How great it was to have fun with my cousins and run around in the rain.



Quite a different experience, isn't it? Much more lightness and small pleasures in the second one, yet they were in the same party.

Are you starting to see where I'm going?

I suggest that you catch yourself, catch your negative thoughts on the fly, to transform them into positive thoughts or at least, constructive thoughts. We are the bosses of our brain; we control where our attention goes. Let's take control back!

What is the positive approach in family coaching?

- It is choosing to see our children's strengths BE-FORE their difficulties.
- It is choosing appreciation and reinforcement over denigration.
- It is accepting imperfections and unforeseen events with all the beauty and diversity they bring.
- It is having confidence that children can improve day by day if we support and love them.
- It is leaving aside the power relationship to enter collaboration towards a common goal: the wellbeing.
- It is accepting that there are bad days even when we manage to stay in the positive approach!

What do all these beautiful orientations lead to? Well, it results in less guilt for the adult, more rich moments shared with the children, fewer irritants piling up, more self-esteem for everyone!

Hello dear foster families,

As soon as the agreement in principle has been signed by the Minister, Chantale and I will begin a tour of the institutions. We will present this new agreement to them, paying particular attention to explaining the changes and their impact on the daily lives of foster families. I will come back to you with the details once everything is signed. Of course, there will be a period of adaptation. Fiscal feedback is expected. I will inform you when the time comes.

Training

If health measures allow it, we will advocate for face-to-face training because they also represent an opportunity for socialization, exchange and sharing for FFs. We will also offer online training in order to provide an alternative for families who have availability or travel limitations.

In addition to training that will help you in your role with children, such as ADHD or attachment disorder training, we will also feature vignettes to help you with the more technical and administrative aspects of your role. For example:

- Guardianship.
- The adoption process.
- Getting to know the DYP and the representation of resources in court.
- Roles and legal responsibility of the resource.
- Roles and legal responsibility of the FFARIQ with the resources.
- Demystify what parental attributes are.

If there are other legal topics you would like to see covered, please let me know. We are also working on developing training on financial aspects (taxes, payroll, etc.).

Hello to you dear foster families,

As I write this, the summer season is coming to an end, and we are preparing for our children to go back to school. I hope that you have taken full advantage of this vacation to spend some quality time with them.

Here's a little review since the last issue of the Inform'Accueil:

Annual Regional Meeting (ARM)

On June 6th, we had our ARM. We had 17 people registered in person and 4 in videoconference with the TEAMS platform. The participation was very low, if I compare it with the other years.

There were no elections this year and due to COVID and the health rules in place, we were not able to find a speaker for the afternoon as we did in other years. No major issues were raised at the meeting. The provisional budget was accepted without opposition.

Agreement in principle

Then we had the vote on the agreement in principle. For this, we held two meetings: one in the morning and one in the evening. In the morning, we had 50 registrations and in the evening 47 registrations. The presentation made via Teams by Mrs. Geneviève Rioux went very well - except for a few technical problems in the morning that were solved by the team at Complexe Laviolette.

The union representative who was assigned to our region, Mrs. Maude Delagrave, has left the FFARIQ to take a position in another field than the union in children's resources. If you have any request for modification of the specific agreement (closing of a place, closing of the resource, temporary freezing of a place...), you can send it to me at my email address sbilodeau@ffariq.ca and I will take care of sending the forms or letters to the institution.

Private regional Facebook

Does daycare get paid for our mixed-bank kids when we return to work after parental leave? Can we put this on our tax return?

No. For daycare, if it is a clinical recommendation from the institution and it has been recorded in the child's classification, then yes, the institution will reimburse daycare. But always ask for a pre-authorization, because sometimes workers will advance on what is reimbursed or not.

For taxes, since they are not our children and we receive an amount from the Minister to take care of them, they will not pay for two places.

On behalf of myself and the members of my committee, I wish you a wonderful end of the summer.

Annual Regional Meeting, June 21, 2021

Transportation reimbursement: How to complete the whole thing?

In the column Types of expenses, you enter transportation to go. In the column Precision, you write home-school-home if you are going back home. Or return transportation. So you will be reimbursed the total of the round trip a.m. and p.m. Don't forget one line per transport, so line 1 = transport a.m. line 2 = transport p.m. But if you are going to take the child to school and back to work, you have to stop calculating the number of kilometers to school. The youth centre does not reimburse mileage from school to work, but it does if you are going home. Also include your pre-authorization. You also enter the total mileage. In the amount column, you do not enter anything.
