#### ARM 2022: We Introduce You to Your Regional Representatives



Statements of certain responsibilities of the institution 2-1.01	In the previous agreement, the institution informed the resource and provided a copy of the policies, directives, and procedures with respect to its service provision. However, it was stated that failure to provide a copy of the policies, directives and procedures did not render them inapplicable.	In the current agreement, the second paragraph has been deleted to <b>require institutions to</b> <b>provide a copy of any policies, procedures or</b> <b>guidelines that relate to resources' service</b> <b>provision, prior to implementation.</b>
	In the previous agreement, the institution was required to inform the resource of any changes to policies, procedures, and guidelines. However, again, it was stated that failure to provide a copy did not render them inapplicable.	In the current agreement, the institution must notify the resource of any new and updated policies, guidelines or procedures and provide a copy of the relevant documents to the resource <b>after discussing them with the association at</b> <b>a local committee for concerted action.</b> The second paragraph was also deleted.
Statements of certain responsibilities in relation to placement and relocation 2-2.01	In the previous agreement, the institution had to consider the people in charge of the resource and the users in its matching/pairing. It did not have to worry about the impact on other people living in the environment.	In the current agreement, the institution must, in its matching and pairing activities, analyze the anticipated impacts of the integration of a new child, so that this integration does not risk disrupting the balance of the living environment, particularly by considering the risks to the health, safety or physical or psychological integrity of the resource, of the other users present in the resource, if applicable, and other persons living in the resource.

In the current agreement, for the occupied place, there is a significant change. <b>The place remains</b> occupied, as long as the goods have not been moved. The placement will therefore end upon final departure.
Compensation for the first 60 days 3-3.07	In the previous agreement, a median rate of \$59.01 was set for the first 60 days regardless of the classification level the user had in the previous resource.	In the current agreement, when the child already had a classification level, 3, 4, 5 or 6, this classification will be applied in the new resource. If the classification level was below the median rate of \$59.01, i.e., a level 1 or 2, he/she will receive the more advantageous median rate of \$59.01. If the child is not known to the institution, he/ she will receive the median rate and then, if the classification is higher than this amount - i.e., a level 3, 4, 5, or 6 - the institution will pay the difference to the resource retroactively upon arrival.

# Toward a real negotiation of the collective agreement

The Fédération des familles d'accueil et ressources intermédiaires du Québec (FFARIQ) is deeply relieved by the decision of the Honourable Justice Eric Hardy of the Quebec Superior Court on April 27.

The Court ruled in favour of the vast majority of FFARIQ's demands regarding the provisions of the Act respecting the representation of family-type resources and certain intermediate resources and the negotiation process for their group agreements (ARR).

For several years, the FFARIQ has argued that certain sections of this law infringe on the freedom of association of the resources it represents under our Charters of Rights and Freedoms.

"We salute the work, the commitment and the decision of Judge Hardy. That is why we ask that this ruling be respected. It is essential for the safety and well-being of the children fostered by FFARIQ members that the Quebec government look after their best interests by amending the ARR so that it finally corresponds to the reality of foster families," says Geneviève Rioux, President of the FFARIQ.

First, Judge Hardy states that the limitation or exclusion of collective bargaining on certain subjects in a group agreement infringes on the freedom of association of the resources:

The Tribunal finds that the limitations imposed by the ARR on the right of Resources to bargain collectively over all of the scheduled components of their compensation, as well as the duration of the specific agreements, substantially interfere with their right to collective bargaining. It also concludes that these limitations are not justified under section 1 of the Charter and section 9.1 of the Quebec Charter. Second, "In any negotiation, it is essential that both parties have remedies in order to negotiate on equal terms. In this case, the ARR gives all the power to the Ministry of Health and Social Services. Fortunately, the judge saw what the FFARIQ saw and found that the Ministry cannot afford to prolong the impasse by refusing arbitration or at least imposing undue restrictions. This could force foster families to give up," said Ms. Rioux.

In this context, Judge Hardy rightly points out, with reference to the FFARIQ, the following passage:

Resources are key players in our health and childcare system. They operate 365 days a year, 7 days a week, 24 hours a day. They are the individual citizens for whom freedom of association is so important. Being deprived of the right to strike, an alternative mechanism must be offered to them to allow them to negotiate with the state on a more equal basis. The mechanism provided for in the ARR does not allow them to do so. The Tribunal will therefore declare sections 46 and 53 of the ARR unconstitutional because of their combined effect.

The resources, whose mission is to welcome children into their homes, have very little contact with other resources like their own. They are isolated from each other and do not interact on a daily basis. This is why it is so important that they be able to fully enjoy the right of association that they have.

"The FFARIQ would like to congratulate the other associations with which it has worked closely to advance the cause of foster families and intermediate resources in Quebec. This is a great victory for us all. The FFARIQ is celebrating today a great step forward for foster families and their children and hopes that the Ministry will prioritize the wellbeing of our children and adults by not appealing this decision," reiterates Ms. Rioux.

## « One day, i will bring one home »

#### The couple has fostered 36 children. They have 3 biological children and 5 grandchildren.

Ghislaine made a career of teaching first grade. Unfortunately, she has seen many neglected and unloved children. She remembers, among others, a little boy who always had food on his face, in his hair, on his clothes. She would greet him by saying, "Come on, let's get the toads off. This playful metaphor made the moment "lighter". So, with a little water that toads love, she could erase these traces of the morning meal... or the day before, who knows.

Then she would take care of this little boy's lunch. He arrived each day with a can of lunch. To make sure he had a real meal for lunch and didn't eat his cold can, she would take the can to the cook so she could incorporate it into the day's meal.

"I often told my husband that one day I would bring a child home. This little boy gave me pause for thought and allowed me to see that I would be able to foster one..."

#### After Retirement, Giving Back Remains a Priority

Ghislaine retired 25 years ago. "I was hyperactive," she says. I took advantage of it. I skated on the lake, we travelled with our children and grandchildren. Then, one day, life sent her signs. First, a report on TV in which the DYP was asking for foster families. Then, a little boy in the catechism class she was giving as a volunteer at the parish where her husband

was churchwarden. She had asked the group of children in front of her, "Do you know anyone who lives the way Jesus did? The little boy replied, "My daddy helps young people with their problems." That's how she met her father, a psychologist at the youth centre, who guided her toward becoming a foster family.

Ghislaine and her husband André jumped into the adventure. Their wish: to welcome children from 0 to 5 years old. It was on Friday, November 13, 1998, that little Patricia came into their lives. Born on November 7th, she was only 6 days old. "All she had was a hospital gown, a blanket, a hat and a pacifier. I had set up a crib, bought clothes and everything else needed to welcome a newborn. And I was shaken! The hospital was demanding that we give back the clothes they had provided for the baby."

#### **Patricia's Story**

"We didn't know how long Patricia would be with us. It could be five days, 30 days...we didn't know, but we knew we didn't want to adopt her." So the couple opened their hearts and homes wide for the little girl whose biological mom Maryse had a mild disability. With a significant alcohol problem and overweight, she didn't realize she was pregnant until she gave birth in the ambulance her mother had called because Maryse wasn't feeling well. As for Patricia's biological father, he was struggling with drug use.

The little girl showed some signs of fetal alcohol, such as having her eyes close together. However, she did not have to be weaned from alcohol in her first days of life. She also had very long arms compared to other babies and was not expressive.



As Patricia came into contact with the other children, she became more expressive. She had a great temperament. She was affectionate, knew how to take her place and was not afraid of anything. At the age of one, she didn't speak much, but around 15 months, she started to say a few words. She learned a lot by mimicry from the other children in the FF. With her curly blond hair, blue eyes and endearing personality, Patricia was very cute despite her difficulty following directions.

At the age of 5, Patricia met with a neuropsychologist. Her behaviour at the doctor's office was disturbing: she climbed on the bookcase. Something she never did at home. After an evaluation, she was diagnosed with mild impairment and anxiety. At 17, a full evaluation confirmed the diagnosis of disability and added dyscalculia, a learning disability in mathematics.

Despite solutions provided by Chislaine and her husband, such as providing Patricia with an ATM card since she could not calculate the return of change when making purchases, this difficulty with mathematics limited the young girl in various aspects of her life, including preventing her from



realizing her dream of becoming an orderly, since she had failed the math test. This step was a real grief for her.

#### Making Room for the Biological Mom

In her early years, until the age of 6, Patricia did not want to see her mother. Her mother would visit her at Ghislaine and André's home, but Patricia had a conflict of loyalty. To remedy the situation, Ghislaine asked that the visits be made at the youth centre, under supervision. "I asked the YPB to react and to make sure that the biological mother would no longer come to the house. It didn't make sense! Patricia was hiding. Then, with the supervised visits, Patricia developed a special bond with her mom."

On December 25, 2017, Patricia turned 18. At that time, she participated in the 24/60 special hosted by Anne-Marie Dussault. Patricia testifies to her mother that she loves her, that she is important to her, that she does not feel abandoned or cheated.

I always told her that her biological mother did not know how to take care of babies, but that she had a place for her in her womb," says Ghislaine. We always spoke positively about her biological mother, quite simply. We love her mom like our daughter. She trusts us. She is an important part of Patricia's life. She always had little attention for me on my birthday. She would buy a gift that was always relevant for Patricia to give to me. It is a very nice gesture. Today, Maryse no longer has a drinking problem. The bond that was created between Patricia and her biological mother is a success. As FF, we must respect the mother. We must not judge her. She has a story, and the impact will last forever."

#### Patricia, 23 Years Old, Independent

Today, Patricia is still part of Ghislaine and André's life. She lives on the first floor of their bigenerational home with another foster child who has the same dynamic. They get along very well. Together, the two young women support each other and have gained independence.

Patricia goes to adult school. She has completed secondary 3 in French. In math, she has a grade 3 level. Last summer, she worked in recreation with seniors. She loves it.

#### **Ghislaine and André**

The couple has always been very solid. From the very beginning of their marriage, Ghislaine introduced the sharing of tasks, which was quite avant-garde at the time! "My in-laws couldn't believe it! André and I dated for 4 years before getting married. We already had a beautiful complicity. My husband was zen, joyful, funny, and brilliant. Coming from a large family of 12 children, for him having children in FF was not a big mystery! He was always very present with the children playing outside, walking in the forest. In the evening, he would tell them stories, sitting on the ground, with the children sitting on and around him. It was beautiful to see. We have always taken care of our relationship by allowing ourselves some time alone while a babysitter took care of the kids. At other times, we would take the whole family with the kids to the seashore. They loved it. We would rent a house, and all get together.

If Ghislaine speaks of André in the past tense, it is because he is increasingly absent from reality. "12 years ago, I saw that my husband was losing bits and pieces. I told him we needed to find out what was wrong with him and when we got the results, we would go to Ottawa for a few days to either cry and take care of ourselves or to celebrate. Eventually, André was diagnosed with Alzheimer's. Naturally, from that moment on, the youth centre was notified that we would not be able to welcome any more children.

For a while, Ghislaine was able to reconcile all of this and continue with family outings and trips. After all, being vigilant and caring is in her nature! Then came the time when that was no longer possible. Since 2019, André is in a CHSLD. And Ghislaine is adapting to her husband's absence.

"I go to see him regularly. I live his illness in a positive way. We had a good life. Right now, he recognizes me by my voice and by my touch. I told him that if we hadn't been together, I wouldn't have been able to manage the children at the youth centre. We were accomplices. We were lucky. Providence is good to me; it gave me health. You know, life is full of mysteries, positive things, and challenges..."



# TIPS FROM

## **Guide for parents**

Does your child throw tantrums sometimes? Does he scratch his head or bite his nails? Does he often cry inconsolably just because you told him it's time for bed or because you don't want to buy him a toy?

As children, we are not equipped to understand or express what is happening to us. Children's brains are immature. It is not able to manage all the emotions they feel. The prefrontal cortex, the part that helps us regulate our emotions, is the last part of the brain to develop in adulthood. This is why it is important as a parent to accompany our children through their emotional reactions so that they are not overwhelmed by their emotions.

These are the foundations of emotional intelligence that are essential to their growth and development. In this article, I will share with you 3 tips that will help you accompany your children in cultivating their emotional intelligence.

#### TIP No. 1

Start by explaining to your children what an emotion is and what it is used for. Here's one way to explain it: "Do you know what an emotion is? An emotion is a feeling you get inside your body, in your head and in your heart. There are no bad emotions. Some are pleasant, and others are simply more difficult to live and to go through. But all emotions are important because they express how we feel inside."





#### TIP No. 2

There are no bad emotions, so it is crucial not to ask your children to suppress or bottle up their emotions. Very often we do this because it is uncomfortable for us to have to "suffer" a crisis. Remember that **our children need to feel all types of emotions** and **practise enduring them** to develop self-regulation and emotional intelligence.

#### TIP No. 3

One of the best ways to help your child is to **coach him/her on how to manage his/her emotions.** This is called emotional coaching. Here **are 5 steps to coaching your child to cultivate emotional intelligence.** 

## 1. Be mindful of your child's (and your own) emotions

Observe how different emotions are expressed (facial expressions, body language, etc.)

## 2. Recognize emotion as an opportunity to connect or teach

Encourage your child to talk about their emotions. Offer them guidance before their emotions lead to inappropriate behaviour. Do not ask the child to suppress their emotions by telling them to "stop crying" or "stop yelling," this only devalues their feelings.

#### 3. Demonstrate empathy and understanding

Take the time to listen to your child. Avoid criticizing and judging the emotion felt.

#### 4. Helping your child verbalize emotion

After a good listening, help your child to become aware of his/her emotion and to find the vocabulary to communicate it.

### 5. Help your child find solutions while setting limits

All emotions are acceptable, but not all behaviours are. Use the tip wheel on the next page to provide your child with options for self-regulation.

I would like to conclude with this: in order to cope with the demands of parenthood, it is essential to cultivate your own emotional intelligence, because as a parent, you are the primary tool and example in your children's lives.

As you may know, I am working very hard with the FFARIQ team to standardize the understanding and application of the new group agreement. My main objective is to develop collaboration and partnership with the institutions so that together we can support and respond to your needs in relation to your reality and the ever-increasing needs of children. It is by working on the procedures, by proposing solutions and alternatives, by making sure that your concerns and requests are well heard and understood by the institutions that I intend to achieve this goal.
